THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 28 OF 1966

Parties:—

Kenya Timber and Furniture Workers' Union
and

Amalgamated Saw Mills (East Africa) Limited
(in Receivership)

Issue in dispute:—

Implementation of the Negotiated Agreement (Rural).

1. The Kenya Timber and Furniture Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Amalgamated Saw Mills (East Africa) Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 22nd day of June 1966, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

3. The Respondents are a firm in Receivership since 7th November 1960, when G. Luckhurst was appointed Receiver/Manager under a Debenture Deed. The Receiver informed the Court that he was not a member of any Employers Association or Federation and had always negotiated separate agreements with the Claimants concerning wages and conditions of service of labour employed in the mills. On 22nd October 1963, the Receiver and the Claimants entered into an agreement regulating terms and conditions of the Respondents' employees. In this agreement under the heading of "Wages" it was recorded "to be the subject of future negotiations". No further negotiations appear to have taken place between the Receiver and the Claimants until the Receiver received a letter from the Ministry of Labour on 7th December 1965, requesting him to implement the agreement reached between the Claimants and the Timber Industries Employers Association on 23rd September 1965 (Rural Agreement). The Receiver could not agree to implement the increased wages clause without declaring about 25 employees redundant. In spite of further meetings between the Claimants and the Receiver the position could not be improved and on 25th April 1966, the Receiver wrote the following letter to the General Secretary of the Claimants:—

"With reference to our discussion, I have considered this matter and it appears to me to be quite impossible for the Receiver to pay these Minimum Wages without discharging employees.

I am prepared to implement the Negotiated Agreement, with effect from 1st May 1966, but this will mean that I will have to discharge approximately 25 employees.

As an alternative suggestion I would be prepared to pay the Minimum Wages of Sh. 55 per month plus Sh. 20 ration money, in which case I would not have to discharge any employees.

"If we cannot come to some arrangement in connexion with the above I can only suggest that the matter be taken to the Industrial Court."

The Parties then decided to refer the matter to the Industrial Court in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act 1965, and signed the notification of dispute form on 13th May 1966.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

4. The Claimants submitted that timber was one of the important industries in Kenya and the workers engaged in it should be compensated adequately. The Claimants drew the Court's attention to the fact that majority of the employers in this industry were members of the Timber Industries Employers Association (Rural section) (hereinafter called the Association) and that only about ten employers had not joined the said Association. Out of these ten a few employers had agreed with the Claimants to implement it. The Claimants quoted section 24 of the Trade Disputes Act 1965, in support of their claim that their negotiated Rural Agreement with the

Association should be extended to the Respondents. Section 24 (3) on which the Claimants relied is reproduced hereinbelow:—

"If on a reference under this section the Industrial Court is satisfied that the claim is well founded, then unless the Court is satisfied that the terms or conditions which the employer is observing are not less favourable than the recognized terms or conditions, the Court shall make an award requiring the employer to observe, the recognized terms or conditions as respects all the employees of the relevant description from time to time employed by him."

The Claimants stated that when the Respondents implemented the then agreement they had with the Association in 1963, all the employees used to enjoy the privilege of cultivating some two to three acres of land provided by the Forest Department. Although these privileges were provided by the Government they used to help employees considerably in meeting with their food requirements, but since 1964 these privileges had been withdrawn by the Government; the employees, therefore, had no alternative but to ask for higher wages. The Claimants also submitted that although the Respondents were in Receivership, they had been so, for nearly six years and appeared to be making good profit. In these circumstances they requested the Court to award the implementation of their Rural Agreement with the Association by the Respondents.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

5. The Respondents reiterated the position set out in the aforesaid letter from the Receiver to the Claimants dated 25th April 1966, and stated that the Receivership had continued for almost six years and although the amount due to the Debenture Holders had been reduced there was still a large amount outstanding. No payment over the last six years to the original trade creditors had been made. The Respondents stated that any increase in wages at this juncture would mean further delays in payment to the Debenture Holders and creditors which might lead to forced liquidation and the discharge of all labour. The Respondents drew the Court's attention to the fact that the present labour force amounted to 410 plus supervisory staff of 12 with their numerous dependents amounting to not less than 2,500 to 3,000. The Respondents also stated that when the National Social Security Scheme came into operation they would be obliged to pay out a further £100 approximately per month.

The Receiver gave details of the Respondents' finances as at 31st March 1966, and stated that at the moment there were 195 workers earning less than Sh. 55 and to bring all workers to a minimum of Sh. 55 would cost the Receivership a further Sh. 1,177 per month. The Receiver requested the Court to accept his offer and to allow him about a year on the basis of that offer, after which the Respondents would be prepared to discuss and revise wages of their employees.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the various submissions made by the Parties and finds that the finance of the Respondents in Receivership do not permit the wages being increased to the extent as provided in the Claimants' agreement with the Timber Industries Employers Association (Rural section). The Court feels that the Respondents' offer of raising the minimum wage of all employees to Sh. 55 per month is reasonable in the circumstances and so awards. The Court was considerably influenced by the fact that if the Respondents' offer had not been accepted by the Court it would have resulted in unemployment for about more than 25 workers.

This award shall remain in force for a period of 12 months from 1st May 1966.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 32 OF 1966

Parties:—

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union
and
Campbell Schwartzel and Walker Limited

Issue in dispute:—

Claim for payment of wages for three days.

1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Campbell Schwartzel and Walker Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 24th day of June 1966, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

3. On the morning of 3rd May 1966, all African members employed by the Respondents staged a walk-out. This walk-out followed immediately after the visit of a Claimants' official to the Respondents' workshop. The Claimants had approached the Respondents prior to this date on the matter of their recognition which was under consideration. On the same day both Parties contacted the Ministry of Labour and a meeting was held in the afternoon when it was agreed that all employees should return to work before further discussions could be held concerning the issue of recognition.

On 4th May 1966, when the employees reported on duty they were served with notices of dismissal by the Respondents dated 3rd May 1966. This notice stated as follows:—

"Termination of Employment"

By your refusal to carry out your normal duties on May the 3rd, and by your failure to notify the Company of your reasons for refusal to work, we must advise you that your appointment with this Company is now terminated.

Following a Directors' meeting, and consultations with the Labour Department, it has been decided that new staff must be employed as soon as possible.

Should you wish to return to work with this firm, your application for re-employment will be considered by the Directors."

As a result of this, the employees were puzzled and got in touch with the Claimants whose Organizing Secretary contacted the Industrial Relations Assistant at the Ministry of Labour who was dealing with this dispute. It is alleged that this Officer told the Organizing Secretary that he could do nothing until the 6th as he was occupied with other work. In any case the employees could not resume work in the absence of clarification, on the notices of dismissal, until 6th May 1966, when a meeting took place between the Parties and the Industrial Relations Assistant in the afternoon. At this meeting the Industrial Relations Assistant ruled that the employees had been locked-out by the Respondents on 4th, 5th and 6th May 1966, and that they should, therefore, be paid wages for these days. The Respondents did not accept this ruling and the matter was referred to the Industrial Court by the Parties in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act 1965. The notification of dispute form was signed by the Parties on 30th May 1966.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

4. The Claimants submitted that in the afternoon of 4th May 1966, agreement had been reached with the Respondents whereby, it was agreed that employees would resume their work immediately and that there would be no victimization on either side. It was also agreed that the Parties should get together for the purpose of concluding a recognition agreement, and a meeting was arranged for 7th May 1966. In these circumstances the Respondents clearly went against this agreement when on 4th May 1966, they handed dismissal notices to all those employees who had gone on strike on 3rd May 1966. The Claimants stated that no blame could be attached to employees for not resuming work on 4th May after they had been served with these notices of dismissal, without this matter being clarified, as otherwise, they might have lost their past services with the Respondents. The Claimants pointed out that on 4th May, their Organizing Secretary had contacted an Industrial Relations Assistant at the Ministry of Labour and informed him of what had happened, but this Officer took no action as he was occupied with other matters. The Claimants, therefore, submitted that through no fault of their members, work could not be resumed on 4th, 5th and 6th May, which was directly attributable to the notices of dismissal handed to the employees by the Respondents contrary to the agreement reached in the afternoon on 3rd May 1966. They, therefore, requested the Court to award the employees concerned wages for the said three days.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

5. The Respondents submitted that as a consequence of the walk-out on 3rd May 1966, many customers with appointments were turned away, and the Respondents were obliged to accept the losses involved at a time when they could ill-afford to do so. The Respondents conceded that the dismissal notices that were issued on the morning of 4th May, were the result of a complete misunderstanding between their Manager and the Managing Director. These notices should have been handed out on the afternoon of 3rd May, but due to pressure of work and the general confusion, the employees had already left for home before the Manager could issue them. He, therefore, passed them out on the morning of the next day. Furthermore the Respondents stated that the dismissal letters were also incorrect, again, due to a misunderstanding. The Respondents stated that on the morning of 4th May, the Managing Director had gone to the workshops for the expressed purpose of rescinding the dismissal notices and to re-employ all the employees who presented themselves for work. The employees were asked to come one by one and only two employees presented themselves, but they made certain demands as a prerequisite to their return to work. The Respondents decided that they could not be re-employed under these conditions. The Respondents submitted that on 4th May 1966, no official of the Claimants appeared on the scene. On 5th May another employee came in to ask about his position. The Respondents offered him work without any conditions and he was asked to sign the following letter:—

"We hereby confirm that you have been reinstated in this firm, and that your salary and all benefits, are as before."

The said employee refused to sign this letter and went away. Again, the Claimants' officials were absent the whole day. The Respondents stated that on 5th May, they wrote to the Claimants in reply to their letter of 3rd May, which the Respondents alleged they received on 5th May, setting out all that had taken place on 4th and 5th May. The Respondents submitted that they had been prepared to rescind the dismissal notices and reinstate any member of staff at any time provided that no demands had been made to accomplish this. They further submitted that had the Claimants' representative called to discuss the situation as soon as difficulties arose on the morning of 4th May, the staff would not have stayed away from work believing that their demands had to be met before they could return to their jobs. In these circumstances the Respondents requested the Court to make a nil award.

AWARD

6. After a careful consideration of the submissions made by the Parties, the Court awards that the employees concerned should get wages for a day and a half only and further, that the said employees shall be deemed to be in employment without any break in service.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage surface and sullage water), drawings elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall

be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President of the Republic of Kenya or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall only be used for shops (excluding a petrol station), offices and flats.

6. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shops and/or office purposes only or 50 per centum if used for combined purposes of shops, offices or flats or such lesser area as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its by-laws.

7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

9. - (ii) an indication of the number of bedrooms and other rooms to be completed and ready for occupation within 30 months of the commencement of the term of the grant. Applicants may if they wish submit their plans for subsequent additional development;
- (iii) the number and nature of public rooms to be provided;
- (iv) a description of the amenities and recreational facilities to be provided.

(b) The amount of capital available for immediate development which must not be less than Sh. 600,000 together with a statement from the applicant's bankers or from the representatives of some other financial institution acceptable to the Commissioner of Lands certifying that this amount is either immediately available or will become available during the course of the construction of the hotel.
